

## **Wildlife Biologist Position**

The Nunavik Marine Region Wildlife Board is seeking candidates to fill the position of wildlife biologist. This is a full-time, permanent position based in Inukjuak, Quebec (Nunavik).

### **Organizational Information:**

The Nunavik Marine Region Wildlife Board (NMRWB) is an institution of public government established subsequent to ratification of the Nunavik Inuit Land Claims Agreement. The NMRWB is the main instrument of wildlife management for the Nunavik Marine Region. Decisions are made by a board consisting of 6 members and a chairperson; staff carry out day-to-day activities and report to the board members on a regular basis. **Responsibilities:** As a wildlife biologist with the NMRWB your primary responsibility will be to provide support to the NMRWB's Board of Directors in matters relating to wildlife management, public outreach, logistics, and evaluation of research proposals. You may deal with a wide array of topics including commercial fisheries, species at risk, subsistence harvesting, Inuit Traditional Knowledge, protected areas, industrial development activities, inter-jurisdictional negotiations, etc. Notwithstanding current COVID-19 restrictions, the position will involve travel (approximately 15-20%) within Nunavik and outside of the region.

**Qualifications:** The ideal candidate will have proven wildlife management experience, experience working and living in remote locations, sensitivity to the culture and values of Inuit, and knowledge pertaining to the biology of Arctic wildlife. GIS skills will be considered an asset; knowledge of comprehensive land claims agreements (in particular, the Nunavik Inuit Land Claims Agreement) is also important. As a small organization any unique skills may be considered an asset, especially those relating to wildlife, communication, and office management.

Candidates must possess, at minimum, a B.Sc. in Biology, Natural Resource Management or a related field. A Master's degree in these fields, and/or related work experience is preferable. Ability to communicate in Inuttitut is an asset.

**Salary and Benefits:** The NMRWB salary pay scale for the Wildlife Biologist position closely mimics the Government of Canada pay scale for a BI-03 category position. Within the pay scale, salary will be offered based on education and experience. Benefits offered by the NMRWB include subsidized housing in Inukjuak, a comprehensive insurance and pension plan, a northern allowance to offset the high costs of living in Nunavik, as well as travel and cargo allowances to assist in relocation.
